Veteran highlight

Brandon Myer nearly dropped out of school in sixth grade and settled for a D-average his sophomore year of high school. You'd never guess it if you met him today. He has now completed his bachelor's degree in kinesiology and returned to ASU to work on his master's degree in clinical exercise physiology.

After high school, Myer worked at a local movie theater but soon realized his life wasn't going in the direction he desired, so he joined the Navy, where he served for five years, including one deployment to Afghanistan. While in the military, he started his college education in California and earned two associate degrees — one in medical studies and another liberal arts degree in math and science.



This gave him the confidence to pursue his bachelor's degree at ASU, and though he struggled with school in his youth, Myer said he developed a support system that empowered him to thrive on campus. "Everyone was in my corner and wanted me to succeed," he said.

"Do not give up even though it might seem hard. There is nothing wrong with asking for a little help. Asking for help is something I struggle with because I want to do everything on my own, but that's not how life works. We all rely on each other for something."
