Set up and personalize My ASU

Activate your ASURITE User ID

Your ASURITE User ID grants you access to My ASU and university services. See your admission letter for details if you haven't activated your ASURITE User ID yet. admission.asu.edu/asurite

Stay on top of your tasks in My ASU

Check My ASU often to stay on top of things like when it's time to begin the New Student Orientation Experience, which includes important information about registering for your classes.

Visit the admitted student page

Get ready for your first day at ASU by going to the admitted student page and completing your next steps toward fall 2024 enrollment.

Grant guest permission to vour records and account

Through My ASU Guest Access, you can share your academic records with others, and give them access to pay your tuition and bills. Go to My ASU, select the Profile tab at the top and find "Add a Guest" under My ASU Guest Access Permissions.

Confirm your place at ASU

Review your transfer credits

See how your transfer credits apply to your degree, as well as your progress toward graduation, using ASU's Degree Audit Reporting System. Pay your enrollment deposit

Beginning mid October, you can confirm your place in the incoming fall 2024 class by submitting your deposit. Then make sure to check My ASU often for any Priority Tasks you need to complete to enroll for fall 2024. Deposit deadline is June 1, 2024. my.asu.edu

Start the New Student Orientation Experience

In the virtual transfer student orientation, you will prepare for your first semester by completing essential next steps for enrollment. To access it, log in to My ASU to view details under Priority Tasks, or check out the Transfer Student Orientation Experience website at newstudentorientation.

Request final transcripts

As soon as you graduate or complete your current semester or term, request for your college to send an official final transcript to ASU's Admission Services.

Secure your housing

Make the most of your ASU education by living in an environment that sets you up for success. Explore dining options

Sun Devil Hospitality at ASU has a lot to offer you, from dining halls and casual restaurants to cafes and on-campus markets. If you're looking for off-campus dining options, you'll have plenty to choose from. The metro Phoenix area has something for everyone (but you have to try the Mexican food — Phoenix is famous for it), including vegetarian and vegan options and your favorite comfort foods.

Get around town

As you prepare to start at ASU, have you thought about how you'll get around? For students with cars, we offer plenty of parking. You can also walk, bike or skateboard to your classes, and you can take public transit to get around town. Additionally, ASU offers free intercampus shuttles, which are equipped with Wi-Fi and run between the ASU campuses all day.

How to pay for college

Financial aid can cover some or all of your expenses, but you have to know the various types of aid out there and how to apply for them. It all starts by filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, or FAFSA. File by ASU's priority filing date of Jan. 15 to receive the most aid possible.

Why FAFSA?

The FAFSA gives you access to many need-based sources of financial aid you may not be able to access otherwise, including:

- Grants (money you don't repay).
- Federal Work-Study (money you earn from a student job).
- Low-interest federal loans (less expensive than private loans in the long run).

Steps to complete your FAFSA

Ш	i. Go to tatsa.gov.
	2. Log in using your FSA ID. Learn more about the FSA II at studentaid.gov/help/fsa-id .
	3. Submit your FAFSA application. Fall 2024 admits, select the 2024–2025 application. The 2024–2025 FAFSA application opens in early December.
	4. Add ASU as a school selection (ASU's Federal School Code: 001081).

Monitor your financial aid in My ASU

Once you've submitted your FAFSA, allow three to five days for ASU to receive it. Then, you can track the status of your financial aid in the Finances tab of My ASU (my.asu.edu). If you are selected for financial aid verification, you will receive an email from ASU notifying you to check your Priority Tasks for a list of requested items.

Apply for scholarships

There are lots of scholarships out there, including opportunities based on academic achievement, talent, personal stories, creativity and more. Explore hundreds of available scholarships on ASU's Scholarship Portal. You can filter search results to your specific criteria and store your information when applying to multiple scholarships. The most helpful filters are academic level, residency and location. Keep in mind that you'll need to apply to each scholarship separately, and scholarships are competitive. scholarships.asu.edu/transfers

Review your Financial Aid Notification

After you've been admitted to ASU, submitted your FAFSA and completed your financial aid file, you will receive a Financial Aid Notification detailing your financial aid package. To receive the full amount of aid you are eligible for, enroll full time (minimum 12 credit hours each semester) – any less and your award will be adjusted to match your cost of attendance.

Use the Budget Worksheet

Creating an annual budget is an important part of your ASU experience — it helps you understand your total costs, how your financial aid awards help cover those costs and if there might be a remaining balance due to ASU after your aid is applied.
