# Current Student Experience

Online learning through the end of the Spring semester. Summer course will be offered via digital learning methods as well.

165,000 students online now, K thru 20 with more than 14,000 classes being offered online

We have made available 2,200 additional laptops and several hundred hot spots to enable wi-fi access for people that don't have these tools. Students, university and ASU Prep faculty and staff.

The university continues to remain open. This includes food service, health clinics, counseling services, research labs and all other aspects of the university. Other services available virtually.

University housing remains open for those who must stay and essential services will continue to be provided to students who remain with us on campus.

We have expanded our tele-health systems to include student counseling for all of our community. We are also expanding our academic advising support online.

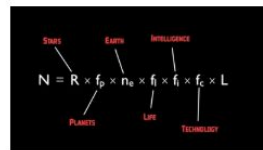

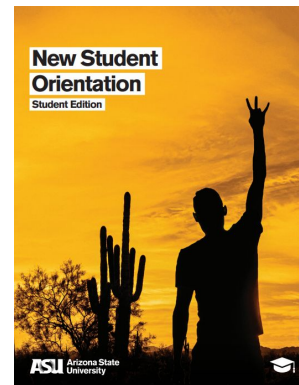

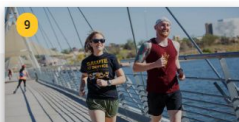
